As I am sure you are aware, there is currently a consultation underway regarding the potential closure of Northbrook swimming pool. A number of parents have asked about the implications for our school so they can put forward their views to the City Council.

We have used this pool for our swimming lessons for many years due to its close proximity to the school, along with its safe walking route. A closure would have an impact on this statutory area of the curriculum for the Junior School, as we would need to use an alternative pool which will increase the cost for both the lessons and the need for transportation.




