#### School Lunches:

Thank you to all parents that are taking advantage of the opportunity to order your child's lunch online. Teachers confirm the choice with the children before the order is prepared. However we are noticing that an increasing number of children aren't sure what the meal is and then want to change at the serving hatch. This has led to some children having to wait while extra food is prepared or offered alternatives. Please make sure your child knows what and likes the meal you have ordered.



#### **SMART WATCHES**

A further reminder that if your child has a SMART watch, we ask you to consider whether it is appropriate for them to be wearing it to school. I know that there are many different versions, but they can be a very expensive item to be brought to school, should they get damaged via a fall or lost, when taken off for PE. Furthermore an important way we safeguard the children is ensuring our systems filter anything inappropriate on the web, but these watches may bypass this and also they allow children to message each other, which is not permitted. We don't want to stop children wearing them, but if used incorrectly they will be taken from the child and you will be asked to collect the watch. Let's let the teachers teach, rather than have to use time on this item.

# Should I keep my

# child off school?



#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
