#### School Parent Survey





## School Survey - September 2023



# Parents are given the opportunity to comment against any of the questions. Below are a sample of the comments and our response.

#### The parent pop in time was quite tricky if you have to pick up from the Infants

We wanted to give parents the chance to meet their child's new teacher, which is why this was from 3.15–4.00. All other parent pop ins are on different days and begin before the end of the school day. Teachers are supportive

The staff always appreciate kind comments like this. They are dedicated professionals who work their best to provide excellent opportunities for all children.

Instead of trying to appoint a lollipop person, the school should ask the council for a crossing, there is nowhere safe for the children to cross

We share parents concerns and are regularly in contact with the council. The school doesn't appoint a school crossing patrol officer, we support in advertising the role. We remind all parents to drive safely around the area and make their own judgements on whether they think their children are old enough to cross the roads by themselves. We continue to teach the children about road safety.

I think there could be a better range of clubs, lunchtime or after school, like at other schools, some are quiet expensive.

We understand that striking a balance is tricky. Premier Sports provide after school clubs, which is at a cost to parents. The variety of clubs can be dependent on the skill set and passions of the teachers. I'm always grateful to staff that feel they can give the time to lead a club or take time to take children away on overnight trips. Children are asked for their opinions on different clubs too.
