### SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING JOURNEY

We know that from time to time everyone needs a little help with the education and well-being of their child. Help or support varies from family to family and may be related to health, including emotional health, learning, attendance, behaviour, friendships, bereavement, finances, housing... the list of difficulties families face seems a long one at times. The Stoke Hill Federation recognises that barriers such as these can stand in the way of a child achieving their very best at school. To provide help and support for children and their families, the Federation employs a full-time Family Support Worker.

The Family Support Worker will provide support and guidance to families and in partnership with them, help remove any barriers to learning, so that young people can thrive and develop.
