

Parents are given the opportunity to comment against any of the questions. Below are a sample of the comments and our response.

My child's teacher doesn't reply to emails, I don't email very often and don't expect a same day reply, but it makes communication difficult.

Teachers work hard to ensure communication is effective. During the school day they are teaching the children and so may not look until the end of the day. If it is urgent then please call the school office and arrange for a call back. We are looking at ways to reduce emails that teachers receive in order to not miss the ones that need quicker responses.

Are there quiet zones or chill out zones that children can go to if they are feeling a bit overwhelmed? Playtimes can be busy times and we do have some individual plans in place for children that need a quieter experience. As an older building we don't have the same zones or spaces that the Infant School does. All children are able to visit Lunchtime Club each day for some guiet time. The bus is open as a chill out zone and the library is also open throughout lunchtime. These spaces all have adults leading activities and we also have Mental Health Ambassadors who lead clubs for small groups of children.

I know there is an annual calendar, but sometimes we don't get enough notice about one off events, for example a Year 4 Greek Day.

We always try to give as much notice as possible and details around events. We'll continue to look at the best ways to make sure parents have enough details and preparation time.

At this time of year, there are lots of illnesses about and we wanted to take the opportunity to share some useful information.

# Should I keep my

# child off school?



#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics



but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek
